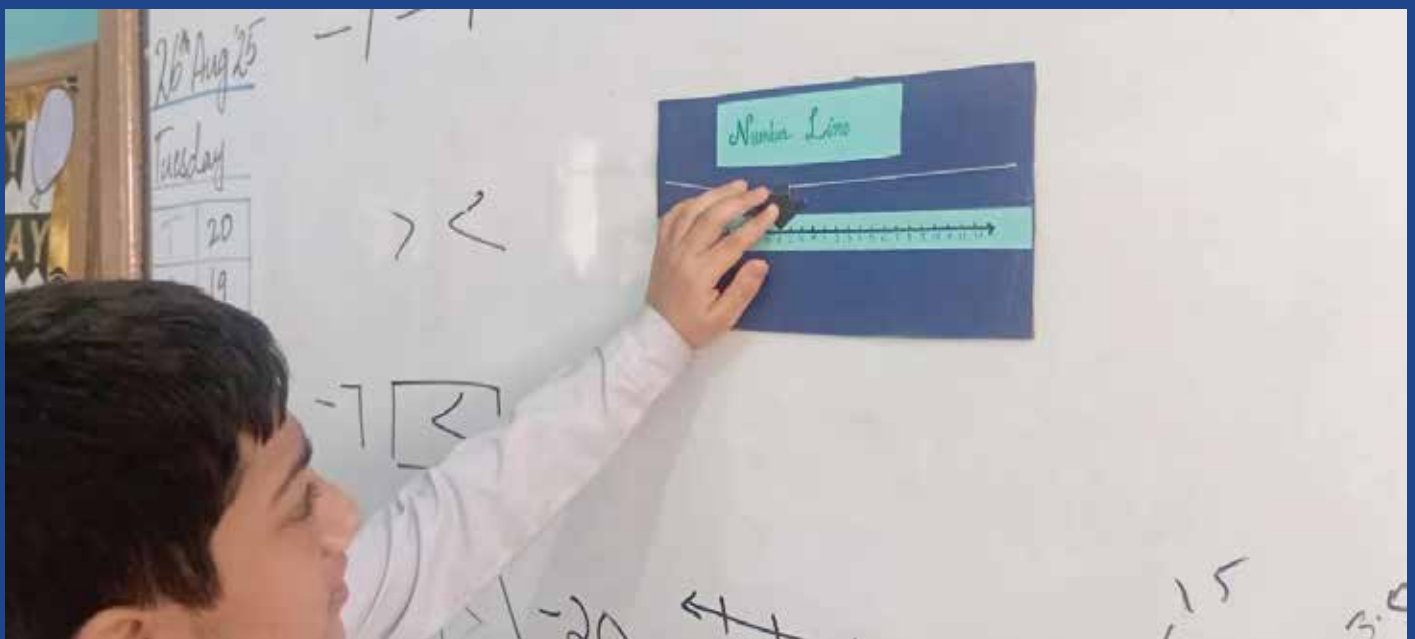
## ADAPTIVE TEACHING STRATEGIES

#### ACADEMIC ACTIVITIES

To make Quranic subjects more interesting and easier for students, the department delivered lessons through modern teaching methods, incorporating interactive activities and educational games. These innovative approaches not only enhanced students' learning but also increased their engagement and motivation.



## PSYCHOLOGY DEPARTMENT

### PROGRESS:

This month at the Boys' School, classroom visits and observations revealed that both students and teachers are experiencing communication challenges and, at times, struggle to understand one another. To bridge this gap, sessions are being designed to strengthen mutual respect, communication, and classroom harmony. These upcoming workshops will guide both teachers and students on classroom rules, complaint protocols, and respectful interaction, ensuring a healthier and more collaborative school environment.



### UPCOMING EQ SESSION:

In addition, following discussions with the Learning & Development (L&D) coordinator, the Psychology Department has planned to jointly conduct a session with teachers focusing on Emotional Intelligence (EQ) and empathy. This initiative aims to inspire reflective practice and foster meaningful changes in teaching styles, ultimately enhancing teacher-student relationships and classroom culture.

### FATIMIYAH GIRLS SCHOOL

#### PROGRESS:

This month's SEL classes in the Primary Section focused on emotional intelligence, resilience, and perspective-taking through creative and interactive activities. Students learned patience through the Marshmallow Experiment, role-plays, and games that linked delayed gratification to real-life lessons such as the boycott campaign. Empathy was nurtured through videos, reflections, and optical illusions, helping students recognize the importance of kindness and perspective-taking. Emotional contagion was introduced through skits and discussions, showing how positivity can spread in groups, while reflection sessions using the camel's build inspired gratitude, self-acceptance, and respect for unique abilities.



## INITIATIVE FOR PARENT ENGAGEMENT:

Parent engagement also began this month with a WhatsApp support group offering faith-based and psychology-backed parenting strategies, supported by videos, infographics, and guides. Meanwhile, one-on-one teacher sessions were held to promote personal well-being and workplace support.



## PROGRESS, FINDING AND PLAN:

At Fatimiyah Montessori System, this month's counseling and classroom observations highlighted ongoing challenges in emotional regulation, particularly separation anxiety, withdrawal, and issues linked to parental separation. Aggression influenced by violent media exposure, inattentiveness, and peer interaction difficulties were observed in younger groups (FMS 1 & 2).

Parent sessions revealed that inconsistent parenting styles and limited developmental awareness often contributed to behavioral concerns. To address these, continuous collaboration with teachers, targeted counseling for students, and structured parental guidance were maintained. The emphasis remained on supporting emotional growth, self-regulation, and positive behavioral change.



## MEDICAL DEPARTMENT

### HAND HYGIENE SESSION

The Medical Department organized and conducted a detailed health education session on Hand Hygiene. The session highlighted the importance of frequent and proper handwashing in the prevention of communicable diseases. Students and staff were guided step by step on the correct handwashing method through live demonstrations. Posters and practical tips were also shared to reinforce the message, ensuring that participants could apply the knowledge in their daily routines.

### FMS INTERVIEWS

During the month of August, the department actively facilitated medical interviews for new admissions at FMS. Each candidate underwent thorough health screening, including history-taking, physical examination, and basic health checks to ensure school readiness. This process not only identified students requiring special care but also provided reassurance to parents and teachers regarding the well-being of new admissions. Documentation and follow-up plans were maintained for continuity of care.



### MEETINGS WITH UNIT HEADS

Formal meetings were held with the heads of units to review ongoing health-related activities and discuss future initiatives. Key topics included coordination of health education sessions, scheduling upcoming assessments, and addressing medical issues raised by teachers and staff. These discussions fostered better collaboration between the health department and academic teams, ensuring that medical support was aligned with the overall needs of the school. The meetings also served as a platform to share challenges and propose practical solutions.

### GENERAL OPD

The Medical Department continued to provide regular daily OPD services throughout August. Students and staff were attended to for common health concerns such as fever, flu, minor injuries, and general checkups. The OPD served as the first point of contact for health care within the institution, ensuring immediate management of health issues and referrals where necessary. Record-keeping was maintained to track recurring cases, helping in early identification of health trends within the school community.
