Regular written work, guided practice, and reinforcement exercises continued throughout the month. The steady routine contributed to a productive and balanced academic period for all students.










### **CELEBRATING ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE**



## MONTHLY NOTEBOOK REVIEW FOR QUALITY ASSURANCE AND OBSERVATIONS




