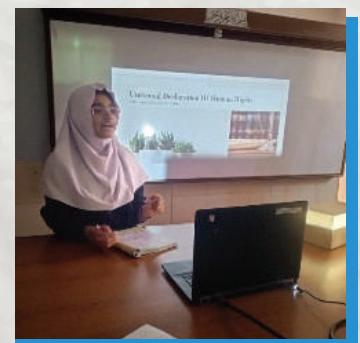
## EXPERIENTIAL LEARNING THROUGH EXPERIMENTS AND MODEL MAKING

## RECOGNITION OF EXCELLENCE IN ENGLISH CONVERSATION

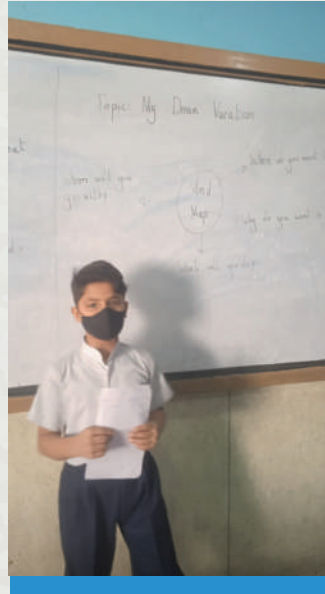

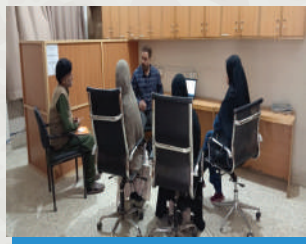
## STUDENT FEEDBACK PROFORMA

## PROUD MOMENT FOR FATIMIYAH COLLEGE

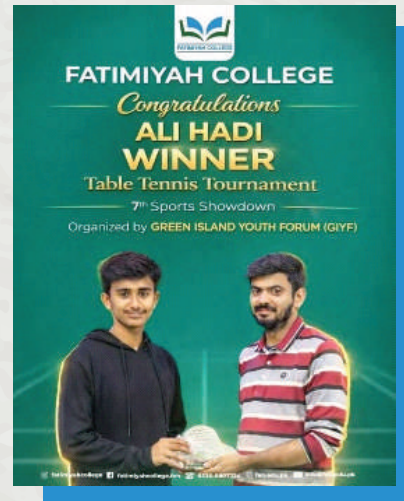

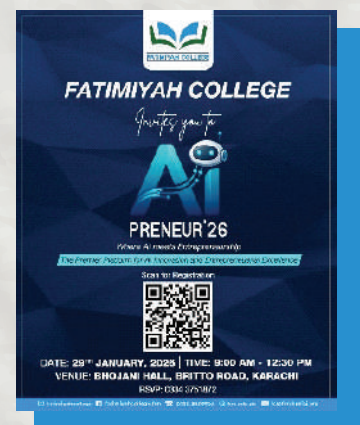
## FATIMIYAH COLLEGE & ST. PAUL'S HIGH SCHOOL: AN ACADEMIC VISIT
